A few words on fireworks: Per Michigan law, fireworks can only be used the day before, the day of, and the day after a national holiday. That means July 3, 4, and 5. This year there will NOT be an organized fireworks spectacle July 3rd emanating from Woodlawn. Beach erosion has affected that lakefront association as well, making the launch site unsafe to use. If you want to utilize fireworks in Shorewood, please launch them from near the water line at South Beach. Fireworks will not be permitted at North Beach since the beach is too narrow and the dune grass too close.
